

MLSPL CONSTITUTION
and
BY-LAWS
Revised April 2026

ARTICLE A - Name

This organization shall be known as the Mississauga Ladies Slo-Pitch League (hereinafter referred to as MLSPL) functioning as an independent association within the City of Mississauga. The Mississauga Ladies Slo-Pitch League is a non-profit organization.

ARTICLE B - Purpose and Objectives

1. The purpose of the MLSPL shall be to provide recreational and competitive slo-pitch on a "League" basis for ladies 18 years of age and over at the time of registration. All players must be 19 years of age by October 1st of that year in order to attend the league banquet.
2. The MLSPL is intended to be both a recreational and competitive slo-pitch league while stressing the "fun" aspect of the game, together with developing good sportsmanship and the elements of fair play.
3. The MLSPL shall sponsor and promote any activity of a special or athletic nature, which will contribute to the finances or goals of the association.

ARTICLE C - Affiliation

The MLSPL shall function as an independent organization, but may at any time become affiliated with another association or agency for the purpose of better fulfilling its own functions and objectives.

ARTICLE D - Area of Operation

The MLSPL is a Mississauga organization and as such, will play all of its season's games in parks within the boundaries of the City of Mississauga, whenever possible.

ARTICLE E - Executive Body

1. Elected Officers (also referred to as League Executive)
An Executive Body comprised of the following elected officers shall conduct the affairs of the MLSPL:
 - a) President
 - b) Vice Presidents – 1 required (until the league expands enough to warrant 2)
 - c) Secretary/Public Relations Officer
 - d) Treasurer
2. Voting Privileges
Each of the above officers, both elected and appointed, with the exception of the

President, who votes only in the case of a tie, shall have one vote.

The team representatives will have a maximum of two votes per team. If a team representative is absent and unable to vote for any reason, an alternate representative may vote in her absence. No proxy voting is allowed. At least one team representative must be present at all league meetings or the team will be fined \$25.00.

All new teams to the MLSPL will have voting privileges on all league business.

3. Election of Officers

The election of the League Executive shall take place at the Annual General Meeting (hereinafter referred to as the AGM) and will be by a majority vote of those officers (as outlined above) present. Executive officers are elected for a two-year term and there can be only two elected officers from any one team. President and one (1) Vice-President shall be elected at the AGM in even numbered years and one (1) Vice-President, Treasurer and Secretary shall be elected at the AGM in odd numbered years.

4. Recall of Executive

At any time and for any reason, a League Executive or a Team Representative may bring forward a motion to recall an Executive. The Executive shall, within a reasonable length of time call a meeting to hear submissions from all parties. Thereafter, the Executive, excluding the member being recalled shall conduct a secret ballot. Should 3 of the 4 Executive vote to recall the member, the member shall be recalled and the position filled at the next AGM. Should the vote result in a tie, the Team Representatives shall be called upon to vote (role call-two votes per team). The majority vote will decide the action.

5. Quorum

At least 50% of the League Executive, and 50% of the team representatives, must be present to form a quorum for the purpose of conducting a meeting.

ARTICLE F - Annual General Meeting (AGM)

1. The Executive Body shall call the AGM. The AGM will be held the first week in October. The order of business for the AGM will be as follows:

- a) Attendance
- b) Correspondence
- c) Old Business
- d) New Business (Elections)
- e) Any Other Business
- f) Adjournment

2. Subsequent meetings will be held during the calendar year. Agenda could include the following:

- a) Present
- b) Constitutional changes
- c) Call elections and fill various other position vacancies; ie. Banquet chairperson, etc.

3. Meeting to finalize Constitutional changes will be called by the Executive at an interim meeting

- a) Presentation of proposed budget and registration

- b) Vote on Constitutional changes and expansion
- c) Playoffs/banquet/recruiting
- d) Appeals, Disciplinary Committee
- e) Other business, as needed

ARTICLE G - Duties of Officers

1. Elected Officers:

- a) President
 - i) shall act as the chairperson at all MLSPL meetings;
 - ii) may act on behalf of the MLSPL where an immediate decision is required and a League Executive meeting is impossible to convene;
 - iii) shall see that all articles of the MLSPL Constitution and By-laws are carried into effect;
 - iv) shall vote at MLSPL meetings only in the event of a tie vote;
 - v) shall prepare, in consultation with the Umpire-In-Chief, a complete playing schedule (including playoffs) as directed by the League Executive;
 - vi) shall, in consultation with the Umpire-In-Chief, reschedule games postponed for any reason, including any games cancelled by mutual agreement of both teams;
- b) Vice-President(s)
 - i) shall be divided between two persons – duties for each one will be set by current President;
 - ii) shall assist the President in performing such duties as may be assigned and, in the President's absence, may act in her place instead;
 - iii) shall keep full and accurate records of all league games, including scores, standings, suspensions, forfeitures and rainouts;
 - iv) shall provide summaries of league games and newsworthy items to the team representatives and local as required;
 - v) shall, with the President, act as a second signing officer for all MLSPL financial transactions;
 - vi) shall co-ordinate all such activities with the Executive Body;
 - vii) shall have one vote at all MLSPL meetings, except when acting as President.
- c) Secretary/Public Relations Officer
 - i) shall maintain accurate records of all proceedings of all MLSPL meetings and see that copies of the proceedings are distributed to all League Executive members;
 - ii) shall advertise with the local media any material required and approved by the League Executive;
 - iii) shall be custodian of all records, correspondence, documents, etc. of the MLSPL except the financial records;
 - iv) shall initiate or reply to correspondence as directed by the League Executive;
 - v) shall co-ordinate all such activities with the Executive Body;
 - vi) shall have one vote at all MLSPL meetings.
- d) Treasurer
 - i) shall keep and maintain full and accurate books of account in which shall be recorded all receipts and disbursements of the MLSPL;
 - ii) shall maintain an account with a Chartered Bank in the name of the MLSPL

- through which all receipts and disbursements are to pass;
- iii) shall act as the first signing officer for all MLSPL financial transactions;
- iv) shall prepare an opening financial statement for presentation at the April spring meeting, an interim financial statement at the end of July and a financial statement of receipts and disbursements for presentation (12-month statement), at the AGM;
- v) shall co-ordinate all such activities with the Executive Body;
- vi) shall have one vote at all MLSPL meetings.

2. Past President: shall act as a consultant to the Executive.

3. Appointed Officers:

a) Umpire-In-Chief

- i) shall be appointed by the League Executive for a term of one playing year;
- ii) shall, within the limitations of the cost placed on him/her by the League Executive, have the duty to establish a group of umpires sufficient to meet the needs of the MLSPL;
- iii) shall designate umpires to handle each scheduled MLSPL game;
- iv) shall provide a list of all designated umpires names and telephone numbers to be given to the Vice President(s);
- v) shall maintain an accurate record of games officiated by umpires for submission to the Treasurer, who will effect payment of umpiring fees. These records are to be reviewed and approved by both the Treasurer and Vice-President, based on league games recorded.
- vi) shall co-ordinate all activities with the Vice President(s).

b) Team Representative

- i) shall express views and opinions of the team they represent;
- ii) shall serve on any committee as appointed by the Executive;
- iii) shall undertake periodically any duties assigned by the Executive;
- iv) shall have one vote at all MLSPL meetings.

c) Banquet Chairperson

- i) shall be appointed by the League Executive at the AGM for the following playing season's year and award banquet.
- ii) shall, within the limitations of the budget costs placed on her by the League Executive, have a duty to organize the year-end award banquet, including dinner/dance/awards/door prizes, as approved by the League Executive.
- iii) shall organize ticket sales in conjunction with the League Treasurer.

MISSISSAUGA LADIES SLO-PITCH LEAGUE BY-LAWS

NOTE:

League Executive herein, refers to President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary and Treasurer.

All General Meetings are attended by League Executive and open to all members of the MLSPL.

Anyone attending League meetings must be registered players with the MLSPL or otherwise invited to do so by the League Executive.

ARTICLE A - Admission of New Teams

1. New teams may be admitted to the MLSPL at the discretion of the Executive Body. If admitted, they will be expected to abide by all provisions of the MLSPL Constitution and By-laws. New teams will be asked to purchase their own equipment (ie. bats, practice balls, league approved bases, equipment bag, etc.). The League will supply game balls.
2. New teams must have their uniform colours approved by the League Executive when the team roster is submitted. Existing teams, which change sponsorship and/or uniforms, must also have their uniform colours approved by the League Executive when the team roster is submitted. Team uniforms must be approved by the League Executive before purchase.

ARTICLE B - Player Registration Fees

1. Each team in the MLSPL will be levied an annual registration fee, as established by the League Executive, each year. The team registration fee will cover the costs of the City of Mississauga User Fees for the city parks, the light fees (hydro), Umpire Fees, SPN affiliation membership fees/dues, administration fees and operating costs, league and championship awards, 10 banquet tickets per team, and any other sundries not mentioned that may be required from time to time. The team registration fee is payable in full to MLSPL and given to the Executive on or before the registration date of the current season.
2. ~~MLSPL does not refund any team fees submitted or individual player registration fees after player has been placed on an existing team. Any refunds are at the discretion of the player's current team. MLSPL does not issue refunds for team registration fees or individual player fees once a player has been placed on a team.~~

~~No refunds will be issued to any team found to be in violation of the MLSPL Constitution and By-laws, or to any team that withdraws after the season has commenced, except under extraordinary circumstances at the discretion of the League Executive.~~

3. Each team member must register and accept a PLAY SLO-PITCH Release, Waiver and Indemnity Agreement to be eligible to participate in any sanctioned activity. Each team member, including subs on the team's roster must purchase an All-Access Annual Pass in order to play in MLSPL.
4. Each team in the MLSPL must register a minimum of 10 players/team up to a maximum of 20 players/team.
5. Additions to a team roster may be made at any time up to July 1st of the current playing season, at which time the rosters will be frozen. The full team registration fee MUST BE received by the Executive before the Spring meeting.
6. Properly completed SPN rosters must be received by the League Executive prior to the date specified by the MLSPL Executive Body. Failure to hand in a completed SPN Form by the date specified will cause the team to forfeit all games until such form is received.

ARTICLE C - Player Participation

1. In order to qualify for playoffs, each registered player must have participated in at least 8 league scheduled games. Participation for this purpose will mean appearing in the field and/or at bat, at least once during a game. If a player can provide a valid Doctor's Note for games missed, these games may be counted for statistical purposes, without the player being present at the game.
2. Players are eligible to play in the league for one (1) team only for playoffs. Regular season and substitute players may sub for other league teams, given that they are only listed on one (1) SPN roster.
3. A score book will be provided to each team by the MLSPL and must be used for each and every game. It will serve as the sole record of league standings, player participation and scores. Additionally, all score sheets must be properly identified with Date, Score, Team Names and Player Names as they appear on the SPN roster to be considered an official record. Score Sheets without all proper information may be rejected as official records. Any team found not keeping an accurate record for each game, including players who played, or found improperly listing players on the score sheet during the game, may forfeit any affected games or may have those games not counted for statistical purposes at the discretion of the Executive.
4. Both Home and Visiting teams are required to submit their scores and score sheets via email to mlsplscores@gmail.com. Each team will be responsible for sending a picture of the scoresheet which includes their team's line up and their opponent's line up, along with the scores of both games. This will be validation for playoffs for players. If a team does not send in the score sheet, attendance will not count towards playoffs for that game for that team. The team and opponents scoresheet, along with the scores must be emailed no later than the Sunday following the Thursday game. Weekly statistics shall be made available and any discrepancies must be reported to the Executive member responsible for standings no later than the following Thursday to be considered for the statistics.
5. Each team will be responsible for maintaining their records of playoff participation. Any teams who have altered the true participation number of a player will forfeit any further scheduled games in the playoffs.

Each team, if questioned, must keep their scoresheets to validate participation of player(s).

6. Players/coaches ejection and/or suspension from any game will be at the discretion of the Umpire. The Umpire will report any ejection and/or suspension to the League Executive and/or The Appeals Disciplinary Committee. Guidelines for the player/coach ejections and/or suspensions will be established by the League Executive and/or The Appeals Disciplinary Committee.
7. For the purposes of both insurance and the integrity of the MLSPL, any teams found placing players, in the field or at bat that are NOT listed on their SPN League Roster, after the date specified by the Executive Body and have NO signed League Waiver, and Photo ID at the park, will receive an automatic 3 game suspension (including the one being played at the time of the infraction) and a \$100 fine will apply. **Note:** the League Waiver must be submitted prior to any player playing on MLSPL diamonds that are assigned a permit number by the city of Mississauga. It is recommended that League Waivers are submitted at the time of Team Registration and/or single entry registration fees. If a team is found attempting to break this By-Law again, within the playing season, will receive an automatic suspension for the remainder of the season.
8. All players placed in the batting order must play at least one defensive inning. This inning must be played within the first 4 ½ innings of each game.

ARTICLE D - Rules and Rule Books

1. The official rules of the MLSPL will be those outlined in the current edition of the Slo-Pitch National (SPN) rulebook. Certain rules will be laid down specifically for the MLSPL (see #3 below).
2. The MLSPL Executive will register each team with SPN annually.
3. The rules specific to the MLSPL are as follows:
 - a) The home team must provide the Umpire with one new league approved softball prior to the commencement of each game. The visiting team must provide a good second ball. Home team is the second team listed on the schedule. The home team has the option of forfeiting home team advantage if they only have 7 players with their 8th player knowingly on the way to the game. If after 3 outs or the team goes through their batting order and the 8th player has not arrived, a default will occur.
 - b) The home run rule is match +2, over the fence only.
 - c) If a player is injured on the field and must be removed from the game, that player is considered a scratch. Next time that player's name appears in the order, there is no penalty and they just move to the next batter.
 - d) Both teams must have in their possession a set of regulation bases and the home plate mat. The home team will be responsible for laying out the bases, in consultation with the Umpire, prior to the game. If the home team does not provide a set of regulation bases, the home team must forfeit being

the home team. If the visiting team puts down the bases, they become home team. If neither team can provide bases, it will result in both teams defaulting (double default). Bases are to be placed 65 feet apart.

- e) "Uniforms" will consist of team shirts that are matching in colour. The shirts must be worn by every player. All teams must be in matching "Uniforms" by July 1st. If a player is not in the same base colour as the team after July 1st, the first at bat for that player for each game will be an automatic out.
- f) "Matching" will be interpreted as "having the same body colour"; the body colour and sleeve colour do not have to be the same.
- g) There will be NO consumption of alcoholic beverages on the park premises (including, but not limited to the field, pavilion/gazebo and surrounding parking lots) or at the surrounding private properties. Umpires shall have the right to check cups, containers or any other vessels on a team's bench for alcohol. Umpires shall have the discretion to eject a player, coach or entire team for alcohol consumption contravening these rules. Additionally, Umpires shall have the discretion to apply a default to one (1) or both games against an offending team and also to assess the League default fees. It is imperative that at all times players, coaches, fans, team representatives, bat boy/girls, etc. must conduct themselves in an appropriate manner to ensure the respectability and integrity of the league and its members. FAILURE TO CONFORM (individual and/or team) MAY RESULT IN EXPULSION FROM THE LEAGUE at the discretion of the Executive.
- h) Parking is only permitted on park premises. Players shall not park in surrounding private properties. Failure to comply will result in one (1) warning, followed by a \$50.00 fine for a subsequent violation. Repeated infractions may lead to expulsion from the league at the discretion of the executive committee.
- i) Teams, coaches and players of the MLSPL found breaching provision of the Constitution and By-laws will be held liable to the League Executive and/or Disciplinary Committee and will be dealt with accordingly.
- j) All divisions will have a 6-run cap per inning in all innings except for the last inning of the game. The Umpire shall clearly indicate to the teams when they may be in the last inning.
- k) The MLSPL maintains a **zero-tolerance policy** regarding the following:
 - Consumption of alcohol or use of illegal drugs on park premises;
 - Smoking or vaping in undesignated areas;
 - Unruly, abusive, or disrespectful behaviour by players, coaches, team representatives, or spectators.

Any individual or team found in violation of this policy may be subject to immediate ejection from the game, game default, fines, suspension, or expulsion from the league, at the discretion of the Umpire and/or League Executive. Repeat or serious violations may result in further disciplinary action by the League Executive.

4. Protests:

- a) Protest Procedure in addition to Article D 4b and 4c -- Any team protesting must alert the umpire that they intend to protest but then continue to play the game at hand. The Team Representative should then notify the League Executive in writing, post-marked or emailed, within 48 hours of the completion of the game. The opposing team will be notified by the League Executive within 48 hours of the receipt of the written protest, and will be provided with a copy of the submitted written protest. The opposing team will be provided with an opportunity to comment on the protest to the League Executive. The League Executive will review the written protest and comments of the opposing team and, if required, will make a decision based on the information provided by both teams. A cheque or money order for \$50.00 payable to the MLSPL must accompany each protest. This fee will be returned if the protest is upheld. If the protest is turned down, the fee remains the property of the MLSPL.
- b) Any team protesting an Umpire or Umpires must follow the Protest Procedure noted in Article D 4a. The League Executive will forward the protest to the Umpire-In Chief for their decision. The League Executive reserves the right to make any or all-final decision on the eligibility of the Umpire to resume their league duties. Note: An Umpire's judgement call cannot be protested.
- c) Any protest involving eligibility of a player, coach or manager, must be made to the plate Umpire at the time of the infraction and before play resumes Both the Team Representative and the Umpire have the authority to request that any team produce a roster, waiver of responsibility form and photo ID as proof of eligibility for a player in question. Failure to produce the appropriate forms and photo ID will result in that player being ineligible for the game, if challenged up to the start of the third inning. Any player participating in a game without appropriate registration is an ineligible player; which means the team defaults the game, and both the player and the team may be subject to additional discipline.
- d) The Appeals Disciplinary Committee and/or League Executive will pass motion on all protests for a final decision. Any decisions made by the League Executive shall be final and binding. Where the protest involves a team on which one of these committee members or League Executive plays, that member must absent herself from any decision in the protest.

5. Games:

- a) League games shall comprise seven innings OR 1 hour and 10 minutes of play, whichever comes first, unless called by the Umpire due to weather conditions, injury or the mercy rule. It is required that a minimum of 8 players be present on each team to commence the regular season game. Additional players may be incorporated into the game within ½ hour of game start time, with the stipulation that they are inserted at the bottom of the lineup, only for the first game (6:15pm) of the first set of double header regular season games and does not extend to subsequent games. If a team defaults the first game, they shall then have 30 minutes to field a team for the second game before a default is declared. No grace period for the second set of double header games.

- b) Teams with only 8 players may borrow a back catcher from the opposing team. The opposing team has the right to refuse to provide a back catcher if they wish. The borrowed back catcher cannot make any plays – their job is to solely throw the ball back to the pitcher. The pitcher of the team with 8 players must run home to make any plays.
- c) Playoff games shall be comprised of seven innings OR 1 hour and 30 minutes of play, whichever comes first, unless called by the Umpire due to weather conditions, injury or the mercy rule. A team unable to field 9 players at the commencement of the game will be given ten minutes grace to provide the additional players needed. If, at the end of these 10 minutes the team is still unable to provide nine players, they will default the game to the opposing team. Home team has the option of giving up home field advantage, in lieu of starting at bat with 8 players, provided the 9th player is on the way. Playoff games mandate a minimum of 9 players per team to commence the game.
- d) All teams must be notified each season as to exact start and finish times, in accordance with planned schedule for that particular season.
- e) The length of a regular season game is set at 1 hour 10 minutes, and no new inning can be started after 1 hour and 5 minutes of play.
- f) The Mercy Rule is as follows for regular season and playoffs:
 - i. Recreational Division – 12 runs after 5 complete innings.
 - ii. Competitive Division – 20 runs after 4 complete innings or 12 runs after 5 complete innings.
- g) The Commitment Line and Scoring Line will be used during all MLSPL games, for both regular season and playoffs.
- h) ANTICIPATION STEP IS NOT PERMITTED. A base runner may not leave the base until the ball has crossed home plate. The base runner must return to the base prior to the next pitch. Failure to return to the base prior to next pitch or if runner leaves base before the ball crosses home plate, the runner will be called out. If a base runner is constantly in violation of this rule a Team Rep may request that the Umpire pay closer attention to the base runner in question.
- i) A game called by the Umpire, during regular season play and playoffs, which cannot be completed due to inclement weather, is considered a complete game after 4 innings of play (3 ½ innings if home team is ahead). Incomplete games will be played from the start.
- j) If a game is tied at the end of seven innings, no extra innings will be played (except in playoffs, at which time the International Tie-Breaker rule comes into effect).
- k) Rulings concerning the above are to be judged by the Umpire, according to the guidelines of these By-laws.
- l) Teams in all divisions will be entitled to 7 courtesy runners per game, runners can be the same player each time. There are no exceptions to this rule unless a runner is injured while running the bases.

There are no extra courtesy runners for any player, regardless of age.

m) No player who is knowingly pregnant may play under any circumstances.

ARTICLE E – Rainout Policy

- a) The City of Mississauga may cancel permits to play on certain fields based on amount of water retained on the fields in previous days. This call is made by the City official by 2pm in the afternoon. In this case, the Executive will notify all Team Representatives to advise that the fields are not playable as soon as possible after receiving the call from the City.
- b) If notification of cancellation is not received by 3pm, all teams are required to be at the diamond regardless of weather for the first set of games. If the first series of games is cancelled, the Umpire will let an Executive Member know right away, and they will contact the team reps to let them know that the second set of games are canceled. If there is inclement weather in the forecast, the Executive will use their discretion as a team to cancel games.
- c) Rained out games will automatically be counted as a split between the teams if there is not enough time in the season to make up the rainout games. If time and the permit allows, all rainout games will be played towards the end of the season. If only one game is rained out, it will be counted as a tie. Games may be rescheduled at the discretion of the Executive if the final standings will be significantly affected.

ARTICLE F - Defaulted Games

- 1. Teams who know in advance that they will be unable to field a team can avoid a default fee if they notify an Executive Member **24 hours prior to scheduled game time**.
- 2. A team will be fined \$50.00 for a single defaulted game or \$75.00 for a double-header default. The default fee **MUST** be paid within 2 weeks from date of infraction. If the team fails to pay the fine within the 2-week assigned limit, they shall appear before the League Executive and/or the Appeals Disciplinary Committee to present why they should not be ejected from the League.
- 3. The score for all defaults will be recorded as a 7-0 defeat for the team in default of the game.
- 4. To avoid a default, teams may use a maximum of 2 league players to field a team to a maximum of 10. There can only be a maximum of 2 league players or substitute players from league teams (“call up players”). Call up players should wear their own team’s jersey or same base team colour and be signified on the score sheet as a call up. The call up players are to play the first game regardless if the original team’s player arrives to play or not. The call up players can bat anywhere in the batting order and play any defensive position. Teams in the Recreational Division can call up players from the Competitive Division, however, those players must either play back catcher or right field and be placed at the bottom of the batting order. Teams in the Competitive Division can call up any player from within their division, or in the Recreational Division.

ARTICLE G - Standings and Playoffs

1. If two or more teams are tied at the end of the regular season;
 - a) Results of only the games between all teams tied, based first on their win/loss record; and if that fails to break the tie,
 - b) Total net runs scored by each team (runs for, minus runs against), and if that fails to break the tie,
 - c) Total runs scored, and if that fails to break the tie,
 - d) If two teams are still tied, a sudden death game will be played,
 - e) If three or more teams are tied, then the total net runs scored by each team in all league games will be used.
2. If any team is ejected or withdrawn from the League for whatever reason, all points from games in which that team participated shall be erased from the League standings and the team registration fee shall not be provided.
3. The Home Team in the odd game of any playoff series shall be the team finishing higher in the regular season standings.
4. The League Executive will decide upon the playoff format. All teams will be notified of the format and receive a playoff schedule by the end of the regular season play.

ARTICLE H - Awards

1. Awards will be presented to the team finishing in first place in each division, at the end of the regular season and to the teams winning the Championship Playoffs in their division. An annual award will also be awarded to the MVP (Most Valuable Player) from each team in all divisions.

ARTICLE I - Appeals/Disciplinary Committee

1. The Appeals/Disciplinary Committee (if required) will consist of one member from each team not in the division that has filed the protest.
2. The Committee who will conduct the Appeals/Disciplinary meetings will elect the chairperson. One Executive may act as a chairperson if elected by the committee.
3. The chairperson cannot be a member of any team involved in any appeals during an appeals meeting. In this case, another Committee member will be elected as chairperson for the appeals meeting.
4. The Committee will make recommendations only to the League Executive. Final decisions will be made by the League Executive and will be binding.
5. During any appeals, at least one member from each team should be present or at least 50% plus one to form a quorum.
6. Guidelines for all activities will be established at a later date by the Appeals/Disciplinary Committee for approval by the League Executive. Any procedures to be established must be submitted in writing to the League Executive by the Committee.

ARTICLE J - Equity Provision

1. The MLSPL Executive Body reserves the right to amend, in any way, any or all of the foregoing Rules and By-laws, in keeping with the true intent and objectives of the MLSPL. Constitutional changes must be voted on with majority membership approval.

ARTICLE K - Dissolution Clause:

If the MLSPL disbands, all equipment and funds will be transferred over to The City of Mississauga, in trust for a period of 5 years. If the league does not reinstate itself after this time, all assets and equipment will be given to a charity of The City's choice.
